

Passes and Tickets

Festival passes and individual tickets can be purchased online before the festival at Prekindle.com or on our website, womentxff.org, or on the day of the show at our ticketing booth inside Studio Movie Grill located at 13933 North Central Expressway Dallas, Texas 75243

Pricing

Festival Pass \$75* Gets you into all screenings, panels and parties.

Student Pass \$65* Same as above. Must show current school ID when picking up pass at our box office. Individual tickets \$11

*Please note that a \$4.74 handling charge applies to each festival pass.

Passes purchased online must be picked up at our ticket booth. Individual tickets purchased online can be printed at home and presented upon entry to the theater or picked up at our ticket booth.

Please note: due to limited occupancy and high demand, a festival pass does not guarantee admission. We recommend arriving as early as possible to secure a seat: at least 30 minutes prior to screening time. Ticket holders in line 15 minutes prior to screening, but denied admission due to limited occupancy will receive a full refund or credit towards another screening.

Rush Lines

A screening becomes "Rush Line Only" when the number of seats reserved for passholders and individual ticket holders equals the number of seats in the theater. All pass and ticket holders should be in line no later than 15 minutes prior to the start of each screening. Passholders are allowed entry into the theater first, followed by ticker holders. After all pass and ticket holders are seated, additional tickets may be available for purchase.

All ticket sales are final. There are no refunds or exchanges except in the event a ticket holder is denied admission due to limited occupancy as stated above. Not all screenings are rated; festival-goers should exercise discretion. Screenings not in English are presented with subtitles except when otherwise stated. Screening times and locations are subject to change.

Set entirely in the apartment of adult siblings Julian and Sunny, Paris Window follows the damaging effects of a series of hypnosis infomercials on the socially and emotionally stunted pair. With creeping intensity, the delusional and codependent brother and sister turn on each other as Julian believes something is afoul when Sunny begins dating a man who looks exactly like him. Paris Window blends the single set claustrophobia of Polanski's Repulsion with the doppelgänger obsession of Dostoyevsky's The Double and the hallucinatory paranoia of Cronenberg's Videodrome.
